On December 5th Geoff Schaaf, four time Emmy award winning director/cinematographer gave us a presentation about his growing up as an USAF dependent. His father was assigned to USAF Photo Recon units. Geoff was able to learn to take pictures with help of the USAF photographers in his father's unit. He showed us pictures growing up on the Leon-Couvron AB, France. From France, his father was stationed at McClellan AFB, CA where Geoff learned to fly at the base Aero Club. In addition to his aircraft pilot license he also took up glider flying. His presentation showed his taking wounded veterans up in gliders.

He then told us about how he started his career as a news film photographer for a Sacramento TV station and on to San Francisco as a TV Director and Producer. He was with one of the first US TV crews to do a special in China. From TV, he migrated to camera work on the "Life Styles of the Rich and Famous" show which had him traveling around the world and meeting his wife. Soon he moved to Hollywood to become a director and cinematographer on TV Movies and Series.

He finished his presentation with a recap of his current project which is a movie about the Burmese escaping from the Japanese during World War II. He showed us clips of his father when he was stationed there in WWII and of the elephant scenes in his current project.

2016 Tours and Events

On Memorial Day, two of our members Steve Politis and Guy Chookoorian served as the Grand Marshalls of the Canoga Park/West Hills Chamber of Commerce Memorial Day Parade. Our members rode in two floats (trucks).

In July, the group supported a Cookout at the Pacific Lodge "Boy's Home" in Woodland Hills.

At 10:00 another group of our members attended the Veterans Day Commemoration at the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library. A dozen members attended the City of Malibu's, 17th Annual "Veterans Day" public ceremony.

Veterans Day luncheons were attended by our members at the Fairwinds – West Hills, Retirement Community and the American Legion Post 826, Veterans Day BBQ at the post's Woodland Hills facility. The day's activities ended in the evening at Congressman Tony Cardenas Veterans Day Forum at the Richard E. Byrd Middle School in Sun Valley.


