

Our guest speaker for December 17, 2018 was Mark Reed who reported on an interview he conducted with the Mayor of Tijuana.



On December 4, 2018 Mark Reed conducted an interview with Juan Manuel, Mayor of Tijuana, Mexico. The focus of the interview was to discuss the city's point of view and impact of the caravan currently inhabiting his city as well as how the history of past caravans is different.

During the interview the Mayor was asked what he thought when he first heard about the Caravan approaching his city. He was not happy that the southern states of Mexico and the Federal Government had not registered the migrants as they entered the country. The Mayor stated he thought the people in the caravan were violators of the law. He thought they should have been detained in the south but the National Commission on Human Rights worked to give them a free highway to Tijuana. He told Mark that it was not the first Caravan that has arrived in his city. Thousands came from Haiti, obeyed the law, filled out the proper paperwork and taken care of.

Mark reported they discussed how the US, Mexico and the Central American countries need to work together to resolve the humanitarian problem in the Central American

They also discussed the November 26 rush to the border that was repelled by tear gas. The Mayor told Mark the migrants were misled to believe they could cross the border and were encouraged by people on bull horns to rush the fence pushing the women and children to the front of the pack.

Mark's description of the interview and the Mayor's views provoked discussion from the Wings Over Wendy's audience and it turned into some political opinions about the US Immigration Policies. Mark did not advocate for one side or the other pointing out that he has both American Indian and Mexican heritage in his family. He just wanted to report on the Mayor's view point. December 17, 2018



Our guest speaker on December 17, 2018 was Gil Escontrias, a 35-year LAPD Detective, Veterans and Homeless Supporter and Dog Handler. His assignments have included Patrol, Juvenile Narcotics; School Investigative Buy Unit, Narcotics Buy Team, Community Relations, and Detectives. His investigative assignments include Homicide, Sex Crimes, Art Theft, Burglary, Auto-Theft, Pawnshop Unit, Cargo Theft, Violent Crimes Special Section and Receivers of Stolen Property Units. His most previous assignment was Mental Evaluation Unit where he was responsible for the development and presentation of training programs for Law Enforcement, both sworn and civilian personnel in identification, understanding and dealing with persons with Mental Illnesses.

When working with homeless veterans he started the *Boots to Suits* program that collects suits that are provided to homeless veterans. This last year over 500 suits were collected and distributed to veterans.

Gil then talked about his experiences as a dog handler, training dogs for veterans with PTSD and other people with mental illnesses. The audience was fascinated by his discussion on the various breeds of dogs for the various support they can be trained to perform ranging from Military Guard, IED detection, Narcotics detection to mental ill and elderly companionship. Gil described some of the training techniques used in training. He fielded a lot of questions from the audience on the pros and cons of various breeds. It was a very enlightening talk.

December 24, 2018 Kevin Raskoff, Ph. D.

On Christmas Eve our Guest Speaker was Kevin Raskoff son of Richard Raskoff visiting for the Holiday Break from Monterey, CA. Kevin teaches Marine Biology and Ecology classes at Monterey Peninsula College and specializes in deep-sea jellyfish. He fielded a number of questions from the attendees ranging from his thoughts on climate change, tsunamis, and communications between fish.

Kevin has done a lot of Deepsea Diving and photography which lead to a discussion on the extinction of coral reefs which he contributes to a rise in ocean temperatures. He discussed the large collection of Marine researchers in the Monterey area.

Another area he discussed was the problems of fish farming and the concentration of waste products has on the fish's nutrition value. He also discussed the harvesting of seaweed.

When asked why the ocean water is salty he described that they were originally fresh and as water ran down from the land they brought a lot minerals with it and as the water evaporates it leaves the minerals behind. This lead to his discussing that the earth has gone though cycles where the oceans got warmer and the CO² increased. The current global warming is the opposite for the first time the CO² increased before the ocean got warmer and it has an impact

on science predictions. We look at what's happened in the past to try to make predictions about the future. But what we are seeing today has never happened before. It's an end of one of a cycle that has occurred for the first time and so that reduces our ability to say with any kind of certainty what can happen in the future.

Kevin certainly left us with the impression that the earth is going through a cyclic change and that it has in the past and will in the future. He thinks a lot can be learned by studying the deep ocean that was not possible in the past.

I've been a pilot for more years than I'd care to count, and in that time, I've been privileged to meet some of the most celebrated aviators of the Greatest Generation and beyond.

I'm talking about pilots such as John Glenn, the first man to orbit the Earth, and later a U.S. senator and the oldest person to go to space at age 77; Gene Cernan, the last human to walk on the moon; Bob Hoover, a fighter pilot, test pilot, record-setter, and airshow innovator; Carroll Shelby, a military pilot and flight instructor who became best known for his auto racing and Shelby Cobra car design; and even Arnold Palmer, a legendary golfer and lifelong pilot who famously said that learning to fly was the third best decision he ever made – after marrying his wife and learning to play golf.

All these men are gone now. But they were among my heroes, and they left me – and so many others whose lives they touched – with a lasting impression of something good, strong, and nearly magical. I call it grace.

These were gracious and graceful people, who were always happy to talk with a fellow aviator or enthusiast. They were amazingly generous and willing to give of their time, knowledge, and expertise. They went out of their way to show newcomers that they are welcome and wanted in the aviation community. They embraced everyone and anyone who shared their interest in flying. Every pilot was a kindred spirit. They didn't boast about their own achievements, though they certainly had a right to do so. Instead, they listened, and they shared.

I'm making a personal commitment to do more to emulate the grace of the great pilots I've known, to be generous in spirit and action, to reach out to those who want to fly, and to share what I've learned through a lifetime in aviation. I hope you'll join me. In a world that gets a little less civil every day, living with grace could be the best legacy we can hope to leave for the aviators of tomorrow.



Gus Manders May 3, 1921 to December 20, 2018

Gus Manders was born in Germany on May 3, 1921. He immigrated to the United States at the age of 17 and five years later enlisted in the Army Air Force in 1942 and because he spoke three languages (German, English, and Italian) he was assigned as an Intelligence Specialist.

He served in North Africa and Italy during WWII, mainly as an interpreter. In Vienna, after the war, he met the light of his life, Ricky, who happened to be the sister of his best friend's wife. When he passed, they had been happily married for 72 years, and had three daughters, Susan, Sylvia and Dana.

When they came to the US he worked as a CPA with noted firms until he started his own business, which he had for 45 years. He also worked at CSUN teaching Business Courses.

Gus had a long siege with lung and bone cancer. He will be remembered as a very dear man, who brought joy to all who knew him.

At his request, there will be no funeral. However, on Friday, December 28, there was an Open House at the Manders' home in Woodland Hills. A number of Wings Over Wendy's members attended including: Harlis Brend, Peggy Jean Bassett, Marion Lovelace, Leon Waldman, Lezar Saunders, and Bob Stiles

Judge Don Foster December 24, 1920 to December 26, 2018

One of the longest attending members of Wings Over Wendy's "flew west" two days after his 98th birthday. Don Foster started attending the Monday lunches right after Dennis McCarthy's August 27, 2002 newspaper column about the weekly gathering of veterans at the Platt Village Wendy's. He faithfully attended every week and group event ever since.

Don was born the day before Christmas in 1920. He grew up in Peoria, Illinois. He attended the Virginia Military Institute and spent three years in the infantry and one in the horse cavalry program, but he developed a love of flying when he learned to fly in the late 1930's at an airfield outside his native Peoria, Illinois. He was instructed on the Piper Cub and then went to Indianapolis and took every course he could at the Roscoe Turner Aeronautical Institute. He learned aerobatics, night and instrument flying, cross country flying "the works" as he called it.

When WWII started he worked for the government as a civilian contractor flight instructor. He says "I was much more valuable as an instructor than as a soldier." He initially taught glider pilots then delivered planes all over the United States, Canada, and Alaska. He flew P-51 fighters, B-17 bombers and just about everything in between.

After two years as a civilian he joined the USAAF, trained as an officer and earned his Flight Officer wings. His assignment was to haul people and cargo around the United States and Canada. He was later tasked to fly transport missions between Oran, Algeria and Italy.

Following the war he turned to a career in the law. His law career began in 1947 by attending La Salle Law School in Grand Rapids, Michigan. He did not finish because he was hired as a statistician at North American Aviation in Inglewood, CA.

He married Elayne in 1950 and they had three daughter and a son.

After a few years in California he finished his law studies at Southwestern Law School and became an investigator, claims adjuster and finally when he passed the bar he joined the legal department at triple A.

Later at the National Auto and Casualty Co. he served as their Chief Counsel. He continued growing professionally by joining several private law firms. At these firms Don handled the workmen's compensation cases. While employed as a general practice lawyer in Beverly Hills he took a judge's exam and was placed on the list.

In 1972 he became a judge handling all workmen's compensation cases in Bell Gardens. He was promoted to presiding judge in Norwalk in 1982 and continued to make decisions about workmen's compensation cases until he retired at age 70 in 1991.

Don stated that "There is no question that my experience helped me to be a better lawyer and judge. The discipline and an understanding of the world; seeing how

other people live. It was a great eye-opener and gave me a perspective I never would have had otherwise."

His favorite hoppy was touring the United States on his motorcycle at 70 years of age. He went to Canada six times and even rode on his bike to Tijuana, Mexicali and Ensenada. He was a strong prponet of Electric Cars and Solar Panels.

Don was active not only in Wings Over Wendy's but also as an advisor to law firms on how to use computers to expedite workmen's compensation cases; the Shiners as an active member of the Hollywood Lodge of the Masonic Order; and the Dandelions (military club of pilots). He had a display every year in the Veterans Hangar at Wings Over Camirillo and spoke at many schools and veteran's functions. In May 2018 he was one of the Grand Marshall's of the Canoga Park Annual Memorial Day Parade.

His cheery smile, jokes, fist bumps, white jacket and gentel manner will be missed by all that knew him.




