Karen Vegtel then called active and inactive members to inform them of the meets and how to join over the phone.




Dr. Robert Eisenhart Becomes WOW Presentation Facilitator

WWII B-17 Bomber Pilot Korean War Provost Marshall Civil Defense Director (1922-2003)

Presented by Shannon Muchow Granddaughter and Wings Over Wendy's Member

Shannon Muchow

Shannon Muchow gave us an outstanding presentation on her Grandfather, Lt Col Howard A. Muchow's experience flying B-17's in WWII.

Shannon had a close relationship with her grandparents, even attending a college close to where they lived and five years ago attending 8th Air Force reunions where she met Elmo Maiden. Her Grandfather wrote a memoir titled *FOREVER YOURS – if I ever get home alive*! in 1999 and five years ago, Shannon decided to turn it into an audiobook. Her research found that many of the people in the book didn't know about the book. So she started to find them.

She told us about her father growing up in Sioux Falls, SD, enlisted after Pearl Harbor, attended training at Washington University, met Shannon's Grandmother, and they were soon married. Her Grandfather attended flight training in Texas. Upon graduation, he was assigned to a crew in Lincoln, NE, to join a B-17 crew. She showed us several pictures of the crew and individual crew members. They trained at Rapid City, SD, where her Grandfather had attended college. After their B-17 training, the crew flew a new B-17 to RAF Great Ashfield, England to join the 8th Air Force, 385th Bomb Group

Her Grandfather had kept his letters and candid photos. Shannon showed us several. On his eighth .mission, he ran into heavy flak. On his scheduled 19th mission, he was grounded with a sinus infection, and Robert Davis took his place. On the mission, his aircraft "Mr Lucky" suffered a mid-air collision that cut the B-17 in half. The tail section floated to the ground from 13,000 ft, and the tail gunner, Joe "Frank" Jones survived and was written up in *Ripley's Believe It or Not* and *Time* magazine.

From Shannon Muchow sides Her Grandfather was then assigned to Robert Davis' crew as the Aircraft Commander.

On April 10, 1945, he crash-landed the "Rum Dum" aircraft with an engine on fire after a raid over Neuruppin at RAF Laarbruch, a Canadian Air Strip. He left the plane and returned to England but had the Royal Air Force Wing Commander sign a receipt for the plane.

Shannon accompanied her Father, Grandfather, and their significant others on a trip to visit Great Ashfield in 2002. Her Grandfather died in 2003.

She has also visited many of the crew and finished her presentation, telling us that she returned to RAF Laarbruch, which has a museum and told the curator about the crash of the "Rum Dum." The story is now a plaque in the museum.

Jerry Knotts, Col. USAF (Retired) Wild Weasels in Viet Nam

On April 20, 2020, Jerry Knotts, Colonel, USAF (Retired) gave a presentation to the group on Wild Weasels in Viet Nam and his experience as a Wild Weasel.

Colonel Jerry Knotts retired from the USAF in 1984. During his 24 year career, he had many challenging assignments to include a combat tour as an F-105 WILD WEASEL with the 388 TFW/44TFS at Korat Royal Thai Air Force Base, Korat, Thailand. During this one year tour in 1968, he flew 112 ROLLING THUNDER combat missions in North Vietnam/Laos.

The mission of the WILDWEASEL in Viet Nam was to fly to the combat area ahead of the strike force and destroy the SA-2 (Surface to Air) missile sites and associated AAA gun sites. The WILD WEASEL mission has been called "The Suicide Mission" and featured from time to time on the Military Channel. The probability of survival for a WILD WEASEL was approximately 35% Jerry started his presentation with a narration of a YouTube video titled *Wings Over Vietnam "The Missions"*. The followed with his experiences.

He then answered questions from the attendees.

Jonathan Parshall "Options for Peace, 1945", War Termination Scenarios & **The Numbers Behind Them**

One of the advantages of virtual meetings is Bob Eisenhart can obtain outstanding speakers from all over the world. On April 27, 2020, he hit a home run by getting Jonathan Parshall, U.S. Naval War College, adjunct professor, a lecturer at the WWII Museum, and founder of www.combinedfleet.com. He has appeared on the Discovery Channel and the History Channel.

Jon started by providing the context of the Pacific War in the spring of 1945. He discussed the battles and the percentage of casualties suffered by the United States and the Japanese leading up to the Battle of Okinawa which had

- 75,00 US Casualties (14-20,00KIA)
- 80,00-100,000 Japanese Miltary KIA
- 40,00-150,000 Civilian Dead (out of 300,000 total population)
- Extremely high combat fatigue casualties among American forces

The aggregate casualties in the Pacific War resulted in 17.4% of US Troops vs. 96.3% Japanese Soldiers and civilians. At that point, the war was not winding down and was getting *bloodier*, and *Everybody's* casualties were climbing.

He then shifted to the US leadership and the plans to attack the mainland of Japan, pointing out that the force ratios had averaged 2 US to 1 Japanese. Next, he discussed the Japanese leaders and Japan's military situation, domestic situation, and food situation. Followed by an analysis of the Japanese command decisions, military planning, which lead to 900,000 Japanese troops to Kyushu Island, which the US would have to invade to attack the mainland.

Based on the historical casualty ratios, Jon estimated the US would suffer at least 300,00 casualties.

He then discussed re-appraisal of an invasion by the US leadership and then *War Termination Scenarios, August 1945*:

- 1. Blockade
- 2. Invasion
- 3. The Bomb
- 4. Demonstration Bomb?

Jon discussed the many problems with a Demonstration Bomb, which concluded that it was not a viable option. He pointed out that dropping the first Bomb on Hiroshima did not dissuade the hardline militarists. Only the use of a second Bomb finally caused the Emperor to intervene.

He then discussed the moral framework of the decision. Pointing out death count per month during this period not only in Japan and US forces, but also China and other occupied countries in the area.

Jon then discussed moral criteria that lead to the conclusions that:

- Dropping the Bomb, as awful as it was, was *clearly* the *least immoral* option available from a portfolio of truly awful options.
- Dropping the Bomb saved disproportionately *more* Japanese lives than any other option.
- Dropping the Bomb led to a much superior post-war political environment for Japan (i.e., no Soviet occupation zone.)

When then had a forty-five minute Q&A session and the conclusion that Johnothan's presentation ranks as the best Wings Over Wendy's has experienced in eighteen years.

Coronavirus won't clip the wings of the Veterans of Wings Over Wendys

LOS ANGELES (KABC) -- A group of veterans who meet every Monday morning since 2001 in the western San Fernando Valley weren't going to let the coronavirus stop them from coming together.

Wings Over Wendy's is a group of veterans, veteran supporters, aviation, and military aficionados that honors all veterans past and present. They meet every Monday and Tuesday morning, 52 weeks per year. Starting in 2001 in the West Hills Wendy's Restaurant, they had only missed one Monday when the restaurant was closed for Christmas.

"It gives veterans, and the like an opportunity to get out of the house," Ed Reynolds, organizer of Wings Over Wendy's, told ABC7.

"It's that comradery, that shared experience ... that's what brings them there," Wings Over Wendy's member Bob Donovan said.

With the serious nature of the coronavirus and the citywide shelter in place order taking effect, the weekly meetings looked as if they were going to become a thing of the past.

"It was pretty devastating for a lot of them because they live for it," Donovan explained.

For the first time in the group's existence, meetings stopped for three weeks, until Ed Reynolds came up with an idea.

"My family went on Zoom the last two Saturday nights, so I spent this last week trying to learn Zoom," Ed said.

Ed mastered the basics of Zoom and the webcam, and with that, Wings Over Wendy's took flight again, allowing its members to come together once more on a Monday.

"If you couldn't shoot them down with a German 88, coronavirus is not going to take these guys out of the fight," Bob told ABC7. Proving that you really can teach an old dog new tricks.

"We're in a steep learning curve here." — Ed Reynolds

They came tip-toeing into our tech heavy world a month ago with more than a bit of trepidation and doubt. But, they made it, bless'em, they're here.

"Yeah, it was like pulling teeth to get them all onboard, and they still don't understand it, but you know something, they're really doing great with our new Zoom meetings," said Ed Reynolds, meeting facilitator for Wings Over Wendy's, a raucous, lovable group of 100 or so mostly older veterans who meet every Monday morning for a cup of coffee and a shot of camaraderie.

For most of them, zoom was a V-8 under the hood of their '65 Mustang, and a cloud was that white thing floating by in the sky your girlfriend always saw an animal in, but you never could.

They could fly a B-24, drop a bomb on a postage stamp, and assembled an M-1 rifle in 30 seconds, but figure out how to use all the gadgets on a smart phone? Forget about it. They'll stick with their old landline.

When Ed told his troops they were going to have to cease meeting because of the coronavirus, it was like they had just been told their best friend died. For a lot of them, especially the widowers and widows of veterans, these meetings were their lifeline, the best over the counter prescription for loneliness they could find.

Sorry, Ed said, but there was nothing he could do. We all have to stay home. He had been keeping in touch with his family using Zoom, but he was far from an expert. How could he ever get this many veterans set in their ways and having trouble following orders to Zoom into meetings? Only one way to find out.

"It took me a whole week to learn, but I figured it out," said the retired Air Force Lt. Colonel. "Now, I had to teach them, which was the real hard part. I spent many hours on the phone, walking them through, step by step, and many of them still didn't get it.

"We have one old guy, a retired engineer, who didn't even have internet in his house. I asked him why? He said when computers came into his company, they started laying off secretaries. He didn't want to be the cause of one secretary losing her job.

"Even my own father warned me not to get into computers, that they were going to be the ruin of mankind and cause massive unemployment," he said. "But there's been more jobs created because of computers, than lost."

The morning of their first Zoom meeting two weeks ago, Ed was nervous. Would it really work? Would his vets come through? Of course, they would. When have they've ever let us down?

"Over 143 signed up to Zoom, including a lot of members who had stopped coming to meetings because they couldn't drive anymore. It was a beautiful sight to see. I opened the meeting for the first hour to basically a gab session, letting everyone catch up with each other."

There was Jimmy Weldon saying a prayer to open the formal part of the meeting, then threatening to hijack an Access van to take everyone over to Wendy's for a hamburger.

There were wives patiently telling their husbands to sit up straight because their friends could only see the top of their heads, and no, they didn't have to shout to be heard, just take your finger off the mute button.

And, plenty of kidding around about all the guys with "chin spinach," who haven't shaved in weeks.

Ed asked everyone to spend some time practicing with Zoom during the week and told them how proud he is that they've learned, and to please call a member who's not on Zoom to give it a try. It won't bite.

"You know, it's impossible to explain, but it's such an emotional thing when everyone says goodbye at the end of the meeting,' Ed says. "We're all wondering if we'll ever be able to be together again under one roof, shake hands and give each other a hug."

No, Ed, it's not impossible to explain at all.

George Pappas OCT 02, 1922 to APR 08, 2020

George Pappas was born in Chicago, IL on October 2, 1922. He grew up in Greece but returned to the US for High School. He enlisted in the US Army and, in May 1942, was sent to China, where he served in ground support positions and served as an assistant to Generalissimo Chiang Kaishek, to the rank of T/5. In February 1945, he was transferred to the Philippines for the remainder of the war.

He proudly wore his uniform and his medals, especially the ones awarded by Generalissimo Chiang Kaishek, and General Douglas MacArthur. He would march in the Canoga Park Memorial Day Parade with Darrell Huston.

George worked in aerospace in the Valley and held a Top Secret security clearance. George led a very colorful life. He once chased down a bank robber who shot at his car. for which he received a commendation from the LA County Sheriff.

He was a very active letter-writer to politicians, judges, ministers, and never shy about expressing his views as a devout anti-Communist and loved to tell the story of John Birch's murder by the Chinese Communists. George was a student of history and could recite ancient Greek and Roman history, especially the military actions. He called many famous people, his "friend," including Louis Zamperini and Dick Rutan.

George attended meetings from May 2005 to 2012 until he moved to Kingman, AZ. He died in a Las Vegas hospital on April 8, 2020.


