West Hills SLO Vege Report

West Hills, LAPD Senior Lead Officer Vege reported to the meeting about the current crime statistics in the area and the LAPD program to etch vehicle identification numbers (VIN) on your auto's catalytic converters to combat the skyrocketing number of catalytic converter thefts.

The goal of this practice is to deter thieves from stealing the converters in the first place. In addition, having the car's vehicle identification number etched onto the converter makes it easier to prosecute anyone caught.

They will also etch the VIN on your auto's glass, deterring auto thefts. The thought process behind VIN etching the car's windows is that if a thief steals your vehicle and tries to resell it, they would have to get the windows and windshield replaced first. Since car thieves usually scratch out the VIN stickers and engravings on the car before selling it or stripping it, they would have to replace the windows, which would be too expensive or time-consuming for them. since a thief would have to replace the windows.



Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird Reconnaissance Plane

On May 2, 2022 the featured presentation was the "Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird New York to London in 1h 54 mins

Lockheed's Skunk Works Division developed the SR-71 as a black project from the Lockheed A-12 reconnaissance aircraft during the 1960s. American aerospace engineer Clarence "Kelly" Johnson was responsible for many of the aircraft's innovative concepts.

The shape of the SR-71 was based on that of the A-12, which was one of the first aircraft to be designed with a reduced radar cross-section. A bomber variant of the aircraft was under consideration before the program was focused solely on reconnaissance.

Mission equipment for the reconnaissance role included signals intelligence sensors, a side-looking airborne radar, and a photo camera; the SR-71 was longer and heavier than the A-12, allowing it to hold more fuel and a two-seat cockpit.

The SR-71 designation has been attributed to lobbying efforts by USAF Chief of Staff General Curtis LeMay, who preferred the SR (Strategic Reconnaissance) designation over simply RS (Reconnaissance, Strategic). The aircraft was introduced to operational service in January 1966.

During aerial reconnaissance missions, the SR-71 operated at high speeds and altitudes (Mach 3.2 and 85,000 feet, 25,900 meters) to allow it to outrace threats. If a surface-to-air missile launch was detected, the standard evasive action was simply to accelerate and outfly the missile. On average, each SR-71 could fly once per week due to the extended turnaround required after mission recovery. A total of 32 aircraft were built; 12 were lost in accidents with none lost to enemy action. During 1988, the USAF retired the SR-71 largely for political reasons; several were briefly reactivated during the 1990s before their second retirement in 1998. (Continued page 3)

NASA was the final operator of the type, retiring their examples in 1999. Since its retirement, the SR-71's role has been taken up by a combination of reconnaissance satellites and unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs); a proposed UAV successor, the SR-72 is under development by Lockheed Martin and scheduled to fly in 2025. As a result, the SR-71 has been given several nicknames, including "Blackbird" and "Habu." As of 2021, the SR-71 continues to hold the official world record it set in 1976 for the fastest air-breathing manned aircraft, previously held by the related Lockheed YF-12.

The SR-71 was the world's fastest and highest-flying air-breathing operational manned aircraft throughout its career.



On the day after the 77th anniversary of V-E day, the end of WWII in Europe, we watched a video titled "*World War II in HD Color – Victory in Europe*" produced by Paulo Carvalho and the British company Dailymotion.

The video documented an overview of the war in Europe and the last several months as the Allied forces entered Germany and prepared to cross the Rhine River.

The rivalry between the Allied Armies to cross the river and capture Berlin.

It concluded with the signing of unconditional surrender by the Germans and the Post War trials of the German leadership

Spectacular Oshkosh Highlights! EAA AirVenture 2021

On May 16, 2022, the featured presentation was *Spectacular Oshkosh Highlights! EAA AirVenture 2021*.

EAA AirVenture is the largest event on the airshow calendar each year. During the show's week, the event can best be described as "aviation overload," with over 10,000 aircraft and hundreds of thousands of airventure geeks descending into Oshkosh, WI.

The video starts with the unique homebuilt aircraft, Bally's Bomber (a scale B-17!). Then, it shows vintage airliners like the Samaritan's Purse DC-8, plus special arrivals and departures like a German Air Force A400 Atlas and a Boeing 747-8F.

Oshkosh's legendary mass formations are featured with different warbird themes throughout the week, like light warbirds and vintage jet warbirds.

The video shows a review of the special "75 years plus 1" commemoration of the end of World War II: a two-hour airshow segment that used more than 40 warbirds to highlight major events during the war like the attack on Pearl Harbor, the D-Day landings, and the air war in Europe.

"Two Buck Chuck" showcased affordable aerobatic aircraft, while the 2022 edition of Adventures of Aviore brings together airshow all-stars in a creative performance. Aviation of all types is celebrated with flybys by agricultural crop sprayers, a Goodyear Blimp demonstration, and innovative electric VTOL aircraft like the bizarre-looking Volocopter.

The video slows things down with a look at the twilight STOL demonstration on the ultralight runway before speeding things up with the US Air Force Special Operations Command (AFSOC) demonstrations featuring an airfield takeover by MC-130s, CV-22 Ospreys, AC-47/AC-130 gunship heritage flight, and an eye-popping night flare dump. The military action continues with rarely seen AFSOC types like the U-28 Draco and C-146 Wolfhound, an A-10 Warthog field attack demo, US Air Force Heritage Flight, U-2 Dragon Lady flyby, and the F-16 Fighting Falcon and F-18 Super Hornet demonstration teams.

After purchasing the knife in the kasbah, he tried to use it to open a can, and the handle broke, so he threw it outside in a field.

Months later, in Italy, he had a new roommate who had just arrived from the US. As the "newbie" unpacked his bag, Harvy saw the knife and asked him where he obtained it. The "newbie" told him he had found it on the ground in Casablanca.

After Harvey told him that he had thrown it there. The "newbie" who had replaced the broken handle with a shell case gave it back to Harvey, who has kept it for 75 years.

I-400 Class Submarine Japanese's Largest Submarine in WW2

On May 23, 2022, the featured presentation was a documentary on the *I-400 Class Submarine, Japanese's Largest Submarine in WW2*. The documentary discussed the Japanese need for a submarine that could carry and launch aircraft to attack United States cities.

It showed the challenges, design, and construction of the I-400 class submarine. In addition, crewmembers and a pilot were interviewed.

The unique design had two large submarine hulls bonded together, length extended, and a hanger for three aircraft. The aircraft was specially designed with folding wings and tail structures to fit in the hangers built on the submarine's deck.

Fortunately, the war ended before the sub could attack the United States or the Panama Canal.

The Commander of the I-400 fleet (Only two were in operation at the war's end) refused to surrender and committed suicide.(Continued page 5)

After studying the submarines, the US Navy sunk them off of Hawaii so the Soviets could not study them.

Current US Navy submarines are as large and carry missiles instead of aircraft.


Memorial Day 2022

On May 30, 2022, the first presentation was two videos about Memorial Day. It began with a three-minute clip documenting the history of the day. Then, it addressed the questions: what does Memorial Day in honor, and how long has it been a holiday? Memorial Day is a day for remembering those who died serving our country in the military. It started after the Civil War. On May 1st, 1865, in Charleston, SC, more than 10,000 people decorated a commentary to honor those who died in the war. Waterloo, NY, Columbus, MS, Columbus, GA, Boalsburg, PA and Carbondale, IL have all claimed to be the birthday of Memorial Day. For many years it was called Decoration Day. In 1967 the name was officially changed to Memorial Day and in 1968 it was established to be celebrated on the last Monday in May.



In a less emotional theme, we watch a video on the restoration of the B-29 “Doc,” which several in the audience had seen or flown in.




The B-29 that Fought without a Tail


The final presentation of the meeting was the story of the crew of a B-29 that fought without a tail. It detailed the battle damage and the bailout of several crew members.

Ray Halloran bailed out and expected to be attacked by a Japanese fighter, but was surprised that a fighter flew passed him and saluted him. Ray safely landed and became a POW and was brutally tortured but survived. Forty years after the war, he returned to Japan and met the Japanese pilots who shot up his B-29 and the pilot who saluted him as he hung helplessly in his parachute.

It was another emotional video to end the Memorial Day meeting.

Ray Rosenbaum

08/17/1930 to 02/06/2021

Ray Rosenbaum was one of the early members of Wings Over Wendy's. He initiated the *Wings News* as an annual report of the meetings and activities.

He was born on August 17, 1930, to Jack and Queenie Rosenbaum in Cleveland, Ohio.

He was their 4th child after Sylvia, Bill, and Sam, and after only a few months, his family moved to the southside of Chicago.

Ray's military travels began when he was 17 and joined the Naval Reserve directly from Compton College (Straight Outta Compton.). Little did he know he was in for two weeks at sea annually aboard a destroyer and 14 days of seasickness. Finally, after six years of "shaking at sea," he was ready for active duty. So, after taking his last civilian cruise out of Rhode Island, he reported to Washington, D.C.

Dreading he would get destroyer duty, he joyously went aboard the USS Midway, which was being rebuilt in Norfolk. Ray had a journalistic background, but they bounced him around between radar duty, and ET striker before finally he was assigned as the ship's editor,

From 1953 to 1955, he served aboard the Midway and just as he was to take a trip around the world after a Med cruise and shakedown cruise through the Caribbean, Ray was transferred to the Antietam out of Boston.

Another Med cruise followed, and he was finally discharged in Quonset Point and on his way to Los Angeles, which had remained as his resident port.

In Los Angeles, Ray worked for newspapers and in PR until 1963, when he launched my own agency, *Headlines, Ink*. It became a six-man firm and was lucky enough to handle accounts such as Hilton Hotels, Lawry's Prime Rib, several hospitals, and a pile of sports accounts, including the Beef Bowl, racing cars, table tennis championships and boxing matches. Ray once worked for the Official Boxing Record.

Ray met and married his first wife, Charlotte Block in 1959. They raised 3 children: Diane, Debbie, and David. After divorcing in 1979, Ray met and married his second wife, Rita Gelfand in 1985. She is a retired teacher, and together they have raised five children and eight grandchildren.

He joined Wings Over Wendy's one year after it was established in 2002.

Ray loved baseball, especially the Dodgers. He was an avid bowler and poker player and gifted with a fantastic sense of humor. Ray was a joke and storyteller. He often shared with his family the memory of when he played high school basketball in Chicago, and he made the winning shot at the buzzer. "The shot that won the Bell game."

He was a Freemason for over 40 years and Shriner since 1984. He loved to sing and was in a Barbershop quartet for many years.

Ray will be deeply missed by all that knew him.



Bill Attig

Bill Attig, a US Navy veteran and a private pilot was born in Sacramento on September 19, 1940. His family moved around the west coast as he grew up. Bill graduated from Glendale HS in 1958, attended Glendale College, and then graduated from UC Berkley. He served as an officer in the US Navy from 1962 to 63 and then worked at Mattel and other LA-based businesses for several years before becoming a professional wedding photographer.

He was a member of the Quiet Birdman, Air Adventurers' Club of Los Angeles, and Wings Over Wendy's.




