1964 Cold War Photos


The German East-We<mark>st Border, a</mark>nd Berlin Electronic Surveillance Installations Placement and 1964 & 2007 Berlin

The featured speaker at the August 1st meeting was Bob Eisenhart speaking to the group about his experience with the Electronic Surveillance Installations along the German East-West Border and in Berlin.

Bob was raised in an Air Force family, born in San Antonio, and typically lived at 15 different locations before leaving home in 1956 for college.

He was an ROTC graduate and received a Bachelor's Engineering degree from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in 1960; and spent his 2 years on active military duty at the Headquarters of the US ARMY Security Agency (ASA), Arlington, Virginia.

In 1962, he remained with the ASA as a Civil Service Engineer in their European Headquarters, Frankfurt, Germany, until 1965. Bob's presentation described the Electronic Surveillance Installations used by the ASA and East Germans to spy on each other.



Bob displayed a map of Germany, the location of the East German Installation, the border, and the ASA Installation, with pictures of both Installations. He then showed photos and discussed the tower and antennas of the ASA Installation. Finally, Bob showed pictures of the border between the two Installations. The US Army and NATO focused on the thought that if the Soviets attacked West Germany, it would be through the Fulda Gap Region.

He showed pictures of the Gap and a Check Point between East and West Germany.

Due to the East German Installation location, they could surveillance almost all of West Germany. But the location of the ASA Installation limited wide coverage of East Germany, so it was focused on the Fulda Gap Region and could not cover Berlin.



Cold War Berlin

Bob shifted his talk to the surveillance of Berlin. ASA started with vans on the backs of trucks on top of a muddy dirt pile that provided a line of sight coverage of Berlin. Eventually, the Teufelsberg Electronic Surveillance Installation was expanded and surveilled all East Germany from 1957 to 1989.

Bob showed pictures of the towers and radome. He then discussed Berlin, showed photographs he took on a trip to the city in 2007, and compared some of the scenes to 1964.

He then discussed the Berlin Wall System, showing maps and pictures of the various barriers, watch towers, traps, and checkpoints. The most famous was Checkpoint Charlies, and Bob showed his photographs from 1964 and 2007.

Next, Bob discussed and showed photos of the Reichstag, which he toured with his wife Nancy in 2007. He also showed pictures of the Berlin Zoo, which has a sign pointing to the Los Angles Zoo 9684 km.

From Berlin, Bob and Nacy visited the Potsdam Conference Center, The Elbe River location where the US Army and Soviet Forces met in WWII. Bob finished his talk by answering questions.



It was nice to see Dick Gross attend a meeting in person in advance of his 96^{th} birthday.



Judy Lamppu took the morning off from her work at Operation Gratitude to attend the August 8^{th} meeting.



John Duffy


The featured speaker on August 8, 2022, was John

and Liberty following his project in Calgary.




In the documentary, he played a doctor.



John finished talking about his books and touched on his philosophy inspired by Tony Robbins and a project he had to produce a film for the US Marine Corps.



Tom Morgenfeld, USN CAPT (Ret.)


On August 15, 2022, the featured speaker was Tom Morgenfeld, USN CAPT (Ret.), retired Lockheed Test Pilot, to talk about his experience testing the YF-22.

Tom started his presentation by listing the USAF Dem/Val Objectives we had seen last month with a an emphasis that the Dem/Val was not a "Flyoff" head-tohead comparison of the YF-22 and YF-23. He also pointed out that it was an Advance Tactical Fighter (ATF) Engine Dem/Val.

As we learned last month, one of the prime objectives of the ATF was he had to be stealthy. Tom is one of the most experienced F-117 pilots, and he discussed the aspects of designing an aircraft with a low radar crosssection.



Next Tom discussed new cockpit features designed in the YF-22.



He then listed the Lockhead Test Objectives and joked the Test Flight Crew objectives were to: Shoot the engineers and start flight testing!

Ship One Test Objectives were:

- Supercruise
- **Agility**
- High Angle of Attack
- Loads.

Early testing included:

- Wet Runway Operations
- Single Engine Flying Qualities
- Alpha and Beta Back-up Data
- 20 Knot Crosswind Landings


Tom discussed the use of a "Spin Recovery Parachute" and 60° Angle of Attack.

Ship Two Test Objectives were:


- Supercruise

He discussed the AIM-9 launch and AMRAAM launch, Operational Maneuvers,



Then Tom showed a chart of the YF-22 Flight History and one for the Flight Statistics comparing the two engines. He then showed us a short video of the tests.



He then discussed the YF-22's contributions to the production F-22 design. As we know, the YF-22 was selected over the YF-23. Tom stated there was an outstanding performance by two tremendous teams.

Both teams demonstrated they could design, build and safely fly low observable (LO) configured aircraft and deliver outstanding performance and handling qualities. Two new designs and two new engines flew without major incident, 157.4 hours in 3 months.

Tom next opened the floor to questions and then said, "...and Some Days the Bear Bites You!" He then described the events that resulted in his crashing the YF-22.

He told us that in April 1992, a camera crew was set up near the runway to film the YF-22 for promotions. Tom flew around the airport and then flew low past the camera crew. He still had some fuel to burn before landing, so he flew past the cameras again and decided to turn on the afterburners. Unfortunately, a flight control software error failed to prevent a pilot-induced oscillation (PIO) so close to the ground that the plane crashed.

In brief, the report stated the YF-22A was operating in a regime that was susceptible to PIO. The PIO was stimulated by retracting the landing gear during a pulse of a full forward stick, which increased aircraft sensitivity. This, along with a nose-up bias from trim and software, started the PIO as Lockheed test pilot Thomas A. Morgenfeld briefly tried to fly a smooth climb-out.

Tom survived the crash and spent the next year investigating the cause of the accident and testing a fix.

CAPT Steve "Shep" Shepard, USN (Ret)



The featured presentation on August 22, 2022, was a talk by CAPT Steve "Shep" Shepard, USN (Ret), on the Department of Defense POW/MIA Recovery efforts. The talk focused on Shep's time at the Defense POW/MIA office and how intelligence efforts helped support field investigation teams to resolve several cases.

Shep told us that a Case File is created on each MIA, and he discussed the intelligence sources to determine the MIA's recovery.

The office assumed that each MIA was alive until proven otherwise. Since 1973 no cases have been found that MIAs were alive and held prisoner in Vietnam. However, some deserters volunteered to live in Vietnam.

He then gave examples of MIA cases that were resolved. LCDR Alexander Palenscar, whose case recorded he crashed in the sea but was discovered in search of North Vietnamese records to have been shot down over land and had died in the crash.

In another case, Lt Daniel Borah reportedly bailed out but was never reported as a POW. Working with the Vietnamese MIA Office, they interviewed an NVA Officer that had been fighting in the area Lt Borah was bombing. He would not tell the US Caseworker but did show the Vietnamese Caseworker a grave that contained the remains still in a flight suit.

Shep then showed a video of Hanoi, the POW Hanoi Hilton, and the John McCain monument. Next, he showed a video of a dig in Laos showing the detailed methods of digging, sifting through the dirt to find some remains. The video showed the remains of Major Zukowski's F-105 aircraft in Laos.

He ended the talk by quoting a letter sent to the family of a pilot killed in action and then answered questions from the audience.



The Ritchie Boys

The featured presentation on August 29, 2022, was the video of the CBS 60 Minutes episode titled Ritchie Boys: The secret U.S. unit bolstered by German-born Jews who helped the Allies beat Hitler.


For as casually as we often toss around the word "hero," sometimes no lesser term applies. 60 Minutes produced a program about members of a secret American intelligence unit who fought in World War II. What's most extraordinary about this group: many of them were German-born Jews who fled their homeland, came to America, and then joined the U.S. Army. Their mission is to use their German language and cultural knowledge to return to Europe and fight Naziism. As they were known, the Ritchie Boys trained in espionage and frontline interrogation. (Continued page 15)

And incredibly, they were responsible for most of the combat intelligence gathered on the Western Front. Yet, for decades, they didn't discuss their work. Fortunately, some Ritchie Boys are still around to tell their tales, including Guy Stern, age 100.

Jon Wertheim, the 60 Minutes host, interviewed Guy Stern, who was still working and exercising at the age of 100 in Detroit, MI, and is one of the last surviving Ritchie Boys who trained at Camp Ritchie, MD.





David Frey

Paul Fairbrook

Jon interviewed David Frey, a professor of history and director of the Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. Frey stated that "sixty-plus percent of the actionable intelligence gathered on the battlefield was gathered by Ritchie Boys. They made a massive contribution to essentially every battle the Americans fought - the entire sets of battles on the Western Front."

Guy Stern arrived in the U.S. alone at age 15, settling with an uncle in St. Louis. When the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor in 1941, Stern, then a college student, raced to enlist to fight the Nazis.

Guy Stern: I had an immediate visceral response to that, and this was my war for many reasons. Personal, of course, but also in this country - I was really treated well.

In New York, Paul Fairbrook had a similar impulse. Now 98, Fairbrook is the former dean of the Culinary Institute of America. His Jewish family left Germany in 1933 when he was 10.





Victor Brombert

Max Lerner

Victor Brombert, now 98 years old, is a former professor of romance languages and literature at Yale and then Princeton. He was born in Berlin to a Russian-Jewish family. When Hitler came to power, the Bromberts fled to France and then to the U.S. Eager to fight the Nazis, he, too, joined the Army. After recruiters found out he spoke four languages, they dispatched him to Camp Ritchie, where strenuous classroom instruction was coupled with strenuous field exercises.

Among the unusual sights at Ritchie was a team of U.S. soldiers dressed in German uniforms. The Ritchie Boys trained for war against these fake Germans with fake German tanks made out of wood.

Victor stated, "One had to playact with some of the people were acting as prisoners, and some of them were real prisoners."

Some Ritchie Boys were recruited to go on secret missions during the war. For example, 97-year-old Max Lerner, an Austrian Jew fluent in German and French, served as a special agent with the counterintelligence corps, passing information to French underground resistance groups.

After the war, Guy Stern, Victor Brombert, Paul Fairbrook, and Max Lerner came home, married, and went to Ivy League schools on the G.I. Bill. Guy Stern became a professor and taught for almost 50 years.

They all rose to the top of their fields, as did many other Ritchie Boys.

It turns out that author J.D. Salinger was a Ritchie Boy. So was Archibald Roosevelt, grandson of Theodore Roosevelt. As was philanthropist David Rockefeller... and media baron and billionaire John Kluge.

David Frey: Some became ambassadors. Others were actually significant in American science.

And notably, professor Frey says, more than 250 Ritchie Boys continued to work in the intelligence field after the war, becoming professional spies.

David Frey: Many of those who trained at Camp Ritchie went on to the OSS – the precursor to the CIA. That meant that the people who learned their craft at Camp Ritchie played a significant role in setting up what eventually became the CIA

This is a remarkable story. Why do so few Americans know about this?

Warren Weinstein 06/23/1929 to 08/19/2022

Warren Weinstein was born and grew up in Long Beach, NY, the middle boy of three. At an early age, he took to flying seaplanes around Long Island. At 18, he joined the Naval Air Reserve at Lambert Field while attending Washington University in St Louis, MO. He transferred to Floyd Bennett Naval Air Station, Brooklyn, a year later for reserve weekends.

In October 1949, he joined the USAF, was commissioned, and received his pilot wings in February 1951. He was assigned to Albrook Air Force Base, Balboa, Panama, in an Air Rescue Squadron flying B-17 and the SA-16 aircraft. In 1953 he transferred to Kindley AFB, Bermuda, where he flew B-29 air rescue missions for one year before his release from active duty.

He joined a reserve unit flying C-46 troop carrier missions out of Miami International Airport before transferring to Nellis AFB, NV, where he flew the C-47.

Warren separated from the Air Force after accepting a job as a pilot with American Airlines in Los Angeles, CA.

As a civilian, he flew with American Airlines for over 32 years and served as the Pilots Union's Chairman, Allied Pilots Association. Always a strong voice and advocate for the pilots, he was their liaison to the company's executives. In 1982 he served as the National Chairman of the Professional Standards Committee until retirement in 1988, taking his last Hawaiian leg with a packed flight of his family, passengers, and coworkers.

He continued to fly in a rescue unit as a civilian volunteer for the Palm Springs Police Department for 21

years. From 1982 - 1984 he started a program called Safe Rides for the local students in Pacific Palisades High School. This program was created to stop drunk driving and give students a safe ride home. In 1984 after his children graduated, he turned the program over to another parent to keep the successful program going. In 1996 local station Fox 11 in Los Angeles asked him to be their consultant and professional aviation expert. He commentated on various air disasters, including 9/11.

His knowledge, expertise, insights, and experiences have made him a sought-after speaker, commentator, and consultant for businesses, schools, and clubs throughout the southland.

Warren was recently the recipient of the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award. In addition, he was an active member of Wings Over Wendy's, Quiet Birdmen, and the Military Officers Association of America.

Warren was a key Wings Over Wendy's management staff member, arranging monthly tours for the group and serving on the annual Awards Luncheon committee. His contributions to the group will be greatly missed.

Warren Weinstein was a widower to his lovely wife, Diane, married for 50 years. He is survived by his daughter, Alisa, son-in-law, Todd, and his eight-year-old granddaughter, Samantha, who live close by.
