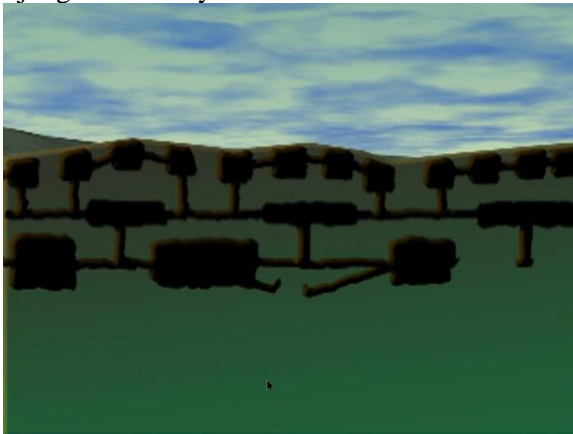
## Stan Zaffos visits WOW

Also, on December 5, 2022, we were visited by Stan Zaffos, from San Jose, CA, a guest of Steve Klausner.



The need to capture the island was predicated by the Army Air Forces B-29 bombers based in Guam, Tinian, and Saipan. They had to fly over Iwo Jima on their mission to bomb Tokyo. The Japanese had fighters based on Iwo Jima that would attack the bombers and a radar site that would alert Tokyo two hours before a bombing raid. If the island was captured, the airfield would be a good emergency landing base for the B-29s.

It was supposed to be a relatively easy invasion, but the Marines had not assaulted an island without the cover of the jungle once they crossed the beach.



The assault troops found the Japanese were hidden in caves and tunnels, plus the beach was not ordinary sand making it difficult to advance across to solid ground. The USMC did not know about the tunnels, and the Japanese Commander had told his men it was their duty to kill ten Marines before dying. Each Japanese soldier should think of their defensive position as their graveyard.

An early objective was the capture one of the three airfields on the island.

Mount Suribachi was the next objective to destroy the radar site and gain a commanding advantage over the rest of the island. Four days after the initial landing, the famous flag was raised on the mountain.

The documentary interviewed Medal of Honor recipient "Woody" Williams. He described his heroic actions using flame throwers to neutralize pill boxes and tunnel entrances.

Thirteen days into the battle, a B-29 landed on the island. But still, the fighting continued on to route the Japanese. The documentary described the actions of the Corpsmen. Finally, on March 26<sup>th</sup>, the few remaining Japanese rushed an airfield and were killed. The battle was over. Approximately 70,000 U.S. Marines and 18,000 Japanese soldiers took part in the battle. In thirty-six days of fighting on the island, nearly 7,000 U.S. Marines were killed. Another 20,000 were wounded. Marines captured 216 Japanese soldiers; the rest were killed in action.

Over 2,000 US bombers made life-saving emergency landings on the island before the war ended. That is about 24,000 airmen saved from having to ditch in the sea.

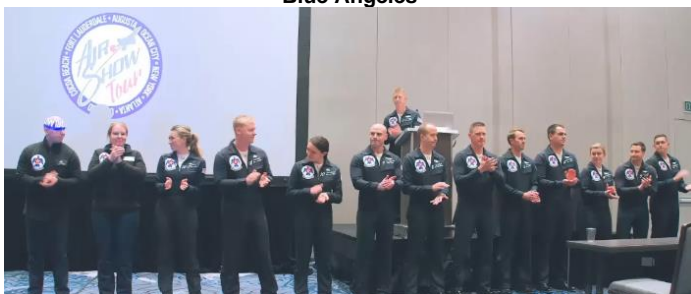

## Atomic Bombing Of Hiroshima Documentary "Ten Seconds That Shook The World"

The featured presentation on December 19, 2022, was the Atomic Bombing Of Hiroshima Documentary "Ten Seconds That Shook The World."

The documentary started with a review of the European Scientist's early nuclear research. Then describes the Nazi burning of books as the reason Jewish Scientist's migrated to the United States. Italy's Enrico Fermi also immigrated to the United States. Lise Meitner, working with German chemist Otto Hahn, was among the first to achieve the successful fission of uranium. Germans held the key to nuclear power but fled to other countries. One of the Germans that fled to the US was Szilard. When he learned about the discovery of fission, he began to work with Fermi to construct a nuclear reactor. Fearing the Germans were doing the same thing, Szilard drafted a letter with Albert Einstein sent to US President Roosevelt.

In the letter, they warned, "This new phenomenon would also lead to the construction of bombs, and it is conceivable—though much less certain—that extremely powerful bombs of a new type may thus be constructed."

In October 1939, Roosevelt formed the Advisory Committee on Uranium. The committee moved slowly until the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Then, in August 1942, the Manhattan Project was formed, and BG Groves was appointed in charge while Hitler's war in Europe gave Germany the pieces to construct an Atom Bomb.

In the US development of a bomb was so secret that journalists were forbidden to even use the word atom in articles. Fermi successfully split the atom in Stagg Field, Chicago and work began across the United States to build and deliver an Atomic Bomb. The initial locations were Pasco, Washington; Wendover Field, Utah; Oak Ridge, Tennessee; and Los Alamos, New Mexico.

When Roosevelt died, Harry Truman learned of the Manhattan Project for the first time. Truman then formed a committee to advise him on using the bomb. Four choices are debated.

1. Invade Japan
2. Demonstrate the bomb on a deserted island.
3. Warn the Japanese in advance of the target city.
4. Drop the bomb

Number 1 would cost over a million American lives and countless millions of Japanese.

Option 2 would run the risk that if the bomb failed, it would lift Japanese morale.

The third choice of prior warning would risk the Japanese moving US POW to the city.

The committee recommended the fourth option to use the bomb without prior warning.

The Air Force is given a list of four cities to not bomb with conventional weapons, so if the Atomic Bomb is used on the city, the effects could be measured. However, the conventional bombing continued on other Japanese cities.

The Emperor wanted to surrender but the Japanese military voted to continue the war.

In Los Alamos, work continued, and on July 16, 1945, in Alamogordo, New Mexico, a test was conducted, resulting in a blast equated to roughly 21 kilotons of TNT.

Truman was in Potsdam and discussed the success with Churchill, who recommended using the bomb. Stalin was notified, but his spies had already informed him, so he didn't appear concerned.

When Truman orders the use of the bomb. The Japanese are requested to surrender but do not respond.

Hiroshima was selected to be bombed on August 6<sup>th</sup> because it had no POW Camps.

The plane selected to drop the bomb is named Enola Gay after Aircraft Commander Colonel Paul Tibbets's mother. The fear that if the plane crashes on takeoff required the bomb to be armed in the air. A Naval Officer was assigned to perform the arming in flight.

The documentary showed: the destruction and after-effects of the bomb, the signing of the surrender, and pictures of the rebuilt Hiroshima. It ends with a display of tests of atomic energy in peaceful uses.

## Darwin Tchan from Vietnam Refugee to INS Agent

The featured presentation on December 29, 2022, was a talk by Darwin Tchan about his growing up in South Vietnam, eventually getting to the United States, graduating from college, and spending a career as an INS Agent.

Darwin was born in South Vietnam, Central Highlands, in 1964. His father was a Taiwanese sent to Vietnam during WWII. When the Communists took over China, he could not return to Taiwan and stayed to raise his family in Dalat. Growing up during the war, Darwin told us stories about his surviving a rocket attack in 1968 which he still remembers.

Darwin told us the story of his family's evacuation to Saigon to escape the North Vietnamese Army (NVA) advance on April 28, 1975. On the 29<sup>th</sup>, Saigon was under a curfew, and NVA tanks were roaming the streets by the 30<sup>th</sup>. He told us about the "Reeducation Camps" and that people would be told they would have a short stay if they turned themselves in for "reeducation," and they never returned.

By 1968 his father arranged to have his family escape via a boat. Darwin told us about the three-week experience in an overloaded boat with no food or fresh water.

Rain storms provide fresh water, and one boat sold them cookies to eat. When they reached Hong Kong, they were not allowed to enter the harbor for one month when the UN directed Hong Kong to let them in. Even then, the refugee boats were tied together. Finally, they were allowed ashore and bused to a jail.

Darwin told us there was a toilet paper shortage in the jail. So each person was given just 4 squares. To this day, Darwin hoards rolls of toilet paper. He spent 4 months in the prison camp and then 6 months in a refugee camp before immigrating to the United States, landing at LAX on September 19, 1979.

He told us some funny stories about attending school when he did not understand English. Eventually, he learned the language and graduated from college,

Initially, he thought he would like to go to Medical School but decided to apply for a government job to pay back the country and the people that had accepted him into the country.

He became an INS Agent specializing in high-sea interdiction, drug smuggling, and human trafficking. He is concerned an “Expert” and testifies in court cases.

Darwin told us about his overseas assignments, which at one point had him assigned to Hong Kong in 1998. A big difference from his first “visit” to Hong Kong in 1975. He joked about his hotel room had two full rolls of toilet paper.

He finished his talk by thanking the veterans in the audience for fighting to enable people like his family to live in a “free” country. But, “Freedom is not free.”

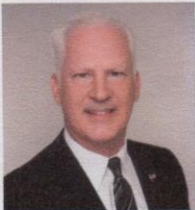
