Wings Over Camarillo Air Show

Wings Over Wendy's participated again in the annual Wings Over Camarillo Air Show. This year's preparation was more difficult than past participations. The Wings Over Camarillo Operations Committee had assigned Frank Lopez as the Veterans Hangar Team Lead and Dwight Fujii as his assistant. Frank had an operation scheduled during the last weeks of July, and Dwight has a full-time business that requires night deliveries to Los Angeles. So, Frank asked Bruce Wiener to take his place with Ed Reynolds assisting Dwight. Recruiting presenters and volunteers was proceeding when Bruce fell ill and was hospitalized. Ed recruited Jim Sommer to assist Bruce, and then Bruce suddenly passed five days before the Air Show setup. Jim and Wayne Smith stepped in to assist Dwight.

On Friday, two dozen volunteers were scheduled to help set up the tables and chairs in the Veterans Hangar at noon. They arrived, but the tables were not delivered. Pizza was ordered as they sat around waiting. Jim was finally permitted to use a cart to get the tables, and they were set up by the time the chairs were delivered in the late afternoon.

Three WWII Aviators

The featured presentation on August 4, 2025, was a video that combined stories of three US Air Force aviators: Joseph McConnell, Jimmy Stewart, and Errol Flynn. The video described their background and service experiences.

Three short YouTube videos were merged into one for the presentation. (Continued page 3)



The first was Joseph McConnell, the USAF top-scoring jet ace pilot. His aerial combat during the Korean War earned him some of the nation's highest awards, including the Distinguished Service Cross, Silver Star, and the Distinguished Flying Cross. His aerial combat during the Korean War earned him some of the nation's highest awards, including the Distinguished Service Cross, the Silver Star, and the Distinguished Flying Cross. Overall, McConnell shot down 16 MIGs and damaged 5, making him America's first triple jet ace.

McConnell flew F-86 Sabres, all named "Beautiful Butch," the nickname of his wife, Pearl "Butch" Brown. In 1954, he was shot down and rescued at sea. The Chinese claimed victory and produced a short film to support their case, but it's most likely he was shot down by the Russians.

Returning from Korea, he met with President Eisenhower and became a celebrity, even appearing on the TV show "You Bet Your Life" with Groucho Marx in 1954. McConnell died shortly thereafter during a test flight at Edwards AFB



A video on James Stewart, a prominent Hollywood actor, followed the McConnell video. He served as a decorated combat leader in World War II, volunteering for dangerous missions in the US Army Air Corps. Despite his age, Stewart was determined to serve, earning a

commission as a second lieutenant and flying over 20 combat missions. His leadership style, calm demeanor, and dedication to his men made him a respected officer, earning him the nickname "Lucky Jimmy." After the war, Stewart continued his military service, eventually rising to the rank of brigadier general, while also pursuing a successful career in film. His legacy as both a war hero and a beloved actor endures to this day.



The last segment described Clark Gable's Military Service. He was a prominent Hollywood actor, who joined the war effort by enlisting in the US Army Air Corps after completing his role in the film "Gone with the Wind." Despite President Roosevelt's suggestion for Gable to focus on patriotic roles in movies and bond drives, Gable pursued military training, eventually serving as a second lieutenant and completing combat missions with the 8th Air Force. Gable's dedication to his duties and his impact on the war effort were recognized with the Air Medal and the Distinguished Flying Cross. After the war, Gable returned to acting but struggled with health issues, eventually passing away in 1960.

Duc Dao Enrolls in LAPD DROP

Duc Dao, announced to the group that he had just passed his 28th anniversary in the LAPD and enrolled in the LAPD DROP program.

The LAPD's DROP program is the Deferred Retirement Option Plan, an optional, voluntary program for eligible sworn officers to receive their normal pay and benefits while simultaneously accumulating their pension contributions into a separate account that earns a 5% annual interest rate. After a set period, typically 60 months, the accumulated balance is paid out to the officer, allowing them to work in their final years of employment and significantly boost retirement savings. The program aims to keep experienced officers on the job.

Jim Sommer Introduced as WOC Veterans Hangar Chief

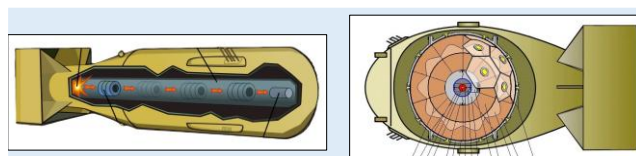

- Silverplate Project - Weaponization of the Atomic Bombs

Silverplate Project, Weaponization of the Atomic Bombs

On August 11, 2025, the featured presentation was a presentation by Dr. Bob Eisenhart on the Silverplate Project.

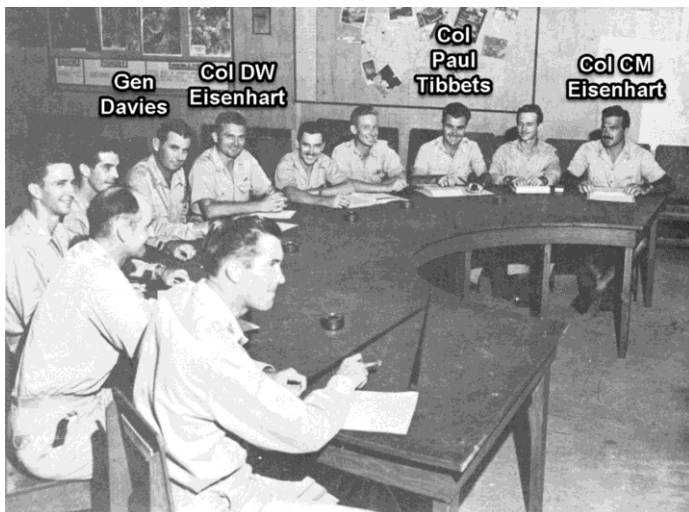


The presentation provided a historical overview of the Silver Plate project, a military subproject of the Manhattan Project, which developed the atomic bombs used to end World War II in the Pacific. Key figures included naval Captain William Parsons, who headed the project, and Colonel Paul Tibbets, who commanded the 509th Composite Group.

Bob provided a detailed background on Paul Tibbets' experience in Europe that led to his selection as the lead pilot for the project. The project involved significant modifications to the B-29 Super Fortress to carry and drop the atomic bombs, with extensive training and secrecy measures in place.

509th Composite Bomb Group – Training on Tinian

May – Week-long "Lead Crew Ground School" on arrival. This focused on procedures regarding air-sea-rescue, ditching and bailouts, survival, radar bombing, weather, wing and air force regulations, emergency procedures, camera operation, dinghy drills, and other topics related to combat operations.

Jun 1945 – Operations began with 9 of the 13 B-29s on hand.

Jul & Aug - Intensive training and mission rehearsal consisting of:

- 17 individual sorties without ordnance
- 15 bombing missions against Japanese targets, radar and visual procedures (90 sorties)
- 12 combat missions in Japan with HE (10K) Pumpkin bombs (37 sorties) all at 30,000 ft.
- 1 mission to Iwo Jima to rehearse unloading and loading an inert Little Boy.

The presentation also highlighted the role of Project Alberta, which assembled and loaded the weapons, as well as the crucial contribution of the cruiser Annapolis in delivering key components.

Atomic Bomb Development and Deployment

The Manhattan Project conducted a series of tests and preparations for the atomic bomb, including a 100-ton TNT blast to calibrate measurement equipment for the Trinity test in New Mexico.

The decision to drop the bomb on Japan was made after Japan rejected the Potsdam Proposal, with Truman giving the go-ahead orders. The first bomb, "Little Boy," was dropped on Hiroshima, followed by the second bomb, "Fat Man," on Nagasaki, both resulting in significant destruction and ultimately leading to Japan's surrender.

World War II Surrender and Aftermath

Bob focused on the historical events surrounding the end of World War II, particularly the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. He provided a detailed account of the surrender ceremony on the USS Missouri, the role of General MacArthur, and the subsequent air missions to deliver supplies to POW camps. He also discussed the decision to drop the atomic bombs, highlighting the

estimated 11 million Allied and Japanese casualties that would have resulted if the war had continued. The presentation included insights from a survivor of Japanese imprisonment, who expressed gratitude for the bombs' role in ending the war. The discussion concluded with a review of historical records and photographs from the era.

Dong Tam Troops Throw Party for Children of Nearby Hamlet

Dong Tam – More than 160 children who live within a snowball's throw of this 9th Division camp had a big Christmas this year when a United States Army-Navy team combined their resources to throw a party. A hot dog, barbecue, games, picture taking, and the distribution of toys, candy, toiletries, writing materials, and dental products highlighted the two-and-a-half-hour celebration.

Several days before the event, Sargent E-6 **Bruce A. Wiener**, 21, of the 3rd Battalion, 47th Infantry, met with a United States Navy representative, Hawthorne, of Lexington, VA, aboard a Navy barracks ship of the Mobile Riverine Force.

The two men decided to work together and host a large party for children living in Tan Thanh, a village bordering the camp's southern perimeter. "I was approached by the battalion and brigade civil affairs officials and asked to plan the party," **Wiener** stated. "They knew I planned a successful party for 200 other local children before Christmas."

Wiener, of Lancaster, CA, was gratified to see so much happiness in the small village. He noted that one small girl, normally shy and indifferent, was “all smiles from ear to ear” after hooking on a huge doll in a “fish for a present” game. Pictures were taken of the children and given to them immediately.

A bag containing a tube of toothpaste, a toothbrush, three bars of soap, one pencil and assorted candies was presented to each child. Games, books, toy trucks and cars, and dolls sent to the Dong Tam Chapel from the United States were also distributed.

Wiener said the Navy supplied more than 400 hot dogs, assorted nuts, soda pop, and fresh fruits.

Funds were raised by the 3d/47th to buy 300 loaves of bread from the nearby city of My Tho. Some of the bread was eaten during the party, and the rest was distributed to Tan Thanh families.

“It was a great party,” **Wiener** concluded. “I know we made some new friends by using the spirit of Christmas to help those good people out.

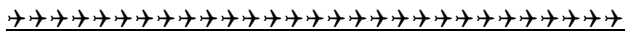

Bruce Wiener

04/15/1947 to 08/10/2025

Bruce Wiener was a native of Los Angeles County. Born in Cluver City, he grew up in Lancaster, where he worked on a farm, was active in the 4H Club, displayed animals in the county fair, and played football at Antelope Valley High School. His family would remark that every time he drove north on I-5, he would roll down the windows to catch the aroma as he passed the stockyards. He had that great sense of humor.

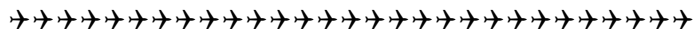
He was drafted into the US Army in 1967 and trained as a paratrooper. In March 1967, he was sent to Vietnam with Company C, 3rd Battalion, 47th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division. Bruce spent a year fighting in seven grueling battles, each lasting more than a week. In the face of intense enemy fire, he performed acts of extraordinary heroism, including rescuing a downed helicopter pilot and saving his platoon leader. He was awarded the Silver Star, three Bronze Stars for Valor, three Army Commendation Medals for Valor, the Air Medal, and three Purple Hearts. Bruce declined an offer to re-enlist and gain a commission. His actions have left an indelible mark on him and all who hear his story.

Returning to civilian life he had many successful business ventures. In 1982, he married Rochelle, an Israeli native, and

raised a family of two boys and a girl in the San Fernando Valley.

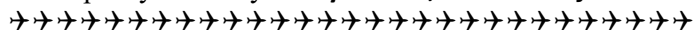
Football had been a cornerstone of Bruce's life. He played at Antelope Valley High School and went on to coach Varsity Football at Chatsworth, Notre Dame, and Taft High Schools, inspiring young athletes along the way. As the former president of the Valley Youth Football Conference, he fostered a love for the game in the next generation.

His family expanded to seven grandchildren before he was invited to join Wings Over Wendy's. He became very active in the organization, serving on the Board of Directors and as the Wings Over Camirilo Veterans Hangar Team Lead.



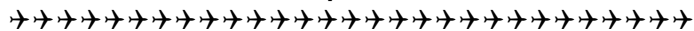




